In addition to magazine and newspaper articles, the database content includes an encyclopedia, Biographies of U.S. Presidents, Country Facts, and *The World Almanac for Kids*.

★ After each question click on *Home Page* in upper left corner to begin a new question

1. I am in seventh grade, and need to do a report on the flu vaccine.

- Click on: *Keyword/Natural Language* radio button
- Type: "flu vaccine" in the search box (use quotation marks)
- Click on: *Search*
- Select: *Challenging* (red box) or *Moderate* (blue box) reading level articles depending on reading ability

2. I need to do a report on vaccines, but a lot of the articles I found are too technical. Can you help me find some easier ones that I can understand? I am in fourth grade.

- Click on: *Subject Headings* radio button
- Type: 'vaccines'
- Click on: *Search*
- Click on: *Vaccines* in the alphabetical list of subject headings
- Select: *Easy* (green box) or *Moderate* (blue box) reading level articles

3. I have to do a report on an animal, but I don't know which one to pick. Is there any way I can browse through some articles about animals, and check out some specific kinds of animals?

- Click on: *Animals* in *Browse Subject Tree* box
- Click on: desired article, or one of the *Topics/subtopics* listed at the right

Tip: Clicking on *Mammals* results in a list of articles about mammals, plus a new list of *Topics/subtopics* for browsing, including the names of specific mammals

4. How can I find a picture of a panda?

- Click on: *Pictures* in the list of *Database Features* found at the lower right corner of the *Home Page* screen
- Type: 'panda' in the *Picture Search:* box

- Click on: *Search*
- Click on: the listed panda pictures until you find the one you want

Tip*: After clicking on a picture, you can see the article it appeared in by clicking the title of the article after *Picture for article:* at the top of the screen

5. I think I'd like to be an architect. Where can I read about some architects and find out what they do?

- Click on: *Notable People* in the Browse Subject Tree box
- Click on: *Architects* in the alphabetical list of Topics/subtopics: listed at the right;

Note: several articles relate to career information in addition to the articles about specific architects

6. I have to do a social studies report on Paraguay. I need to include a map and a picture of the flag, and tell something about the country.

- Click on: *Countries* in the Browse Subject Tree box
- Click on: *Paraguay* in the alphabetical list of Topics/subtopics: listed at the right
- Click on: *Pictures* tab at the top of the results screen to access flag and maps
- Click on: *Paraguay: Flag* to see a picture of the flag
- Click on: *Paraguay* to see maps (two different types – one will have a printable PDF version)

7. I'd like to learn how to do some magic tricks.

- Click on: *Activities* in the list of Database Features found at the lower right corner of the Home Page screen
- Click on: *magic & tricks* in the alphabetical list of Activities

Alternative search:

- Click on: *Kids Corner* in Browse Subject Tree box
- Click on: *Magic & Tricks* in the alphabetical list of Topics/subtopics: listed at the right
- Select: articles with a red "a" following the title to indicate that activities are included

8. I have to do a project for the Science Fair and I don't know what to do. Where can I find some ideas for a good science project?

- Click on: *Activities* in the list of Database Features found at the lower right corner of the Home Page screen
- Click on: *science & nature projects* in the alphabetical list of Activities
- Select: an article on a subject of interest that matches your reading level

9. I need some biographical information about Andre Agassi.

Click on: *Biographies* in the list of Database Features found at the lower right corner of the Home Page screen

Click on: *Agassi, Andre*

Click on: article title to read biography

Click on: camera icon to see Agassi's picture

10. I'd like some articles on Gerald Ford, and how he became president of the United States.

- Click on: *Notable People* in the Browse Subject Tree box
- Click on: *U.S. Presidents* in the alphabetical list of Topics/subtopics: listed at the right
- Click on: *Ford, Gerald Rudolph* in the alphabetical list of Topics/subtopics: listed at the right
